THE IMPORTANCE OF OSHA TRAINING

Because of the many workplace hazards present in both the construction industry and in general industry, Federal and State agencies are very strict about enforcing their safety requirements and standards in these two areas.

We understand that it can be difficult and time consuming to achieve the training required by OSHA. However, training your employees is the key to creating a safe work environment. That is why the Safety Professionals at Sequent provide OSHA Outreach Training Programs all throughout the year for both the construction industry and general industry.

THE 30-HOUR OUTREACH TRAINING PROGRAMS

These programs are intended to provide a variety of training to *management and supervisory personnel* as well as to workers who have some safety responsibility.

- **For the Construction Industry** the training emphasizes identification, avoidance, control and prevention of hazards specific to the particular construction a company engages in. The course also includes becoming familiar with the OSHA standards for the construction industry.
- **For General Industry** the training is specific to the identification, avoidance, control and prevention of hazards typically encountered in general industry businesses. This course also includes becoming familiar with the OSHA standards for general industry.

THE 10-HOUR OUTREACH TRAINING PROGRAMS

These programs are intended to provide *entry level workers* with a general awareness of how to recognize and prevent hazards on the worksite.

- **For the Construction Industry** the training covers a variety of specific safety and health hazards which a worker may encounter on a construction site.
- **For General Industry** the training is designed to cover a variety of safety and health hazards that workers may encounter in a general industry business.

COURSE DETAILS

- Training is provided by our Authorized OSHA Outreach Instructors either in our multi-media training center at our Columbus, Ohio facility or at your facility.
- The 10-hour courses are completed in one day from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm.
- The 30-hour courses are completed in four consecutive days from 7:30 am to 5:00 pm.
- All participants who are present for the full duration of the course (either 10 hours or 30 hours, depending on the course) and complete the training are issued a Department of Labor card that has no expiration date.
- Participants receive a book of reference materials that are covered in the course.
- A continental breakfast will be provided in the morning and drinks and snacks will be available throughout the day.
